KINGS BARTON – NEWS ON ‘SAVE THE ANDOVER ROAD’

A new part of our ward, Kings Barton, is slowly becoming occupied. Tracey is aware that most local residents spoken to support the conservative campaign to Save The Andover Road (STAR). No one wants key traffic to be diverted through the estate nor other parts of our ward to become a rat run.

Tracey is delighted to hear that the Conservative administration at Winchester City Council has advised Hampshire County Council that they support keeping the Andover Road open. The City Cabinet now support finding a way to keep the road open and it is their intention that the Andover Road should remain a key route into and out of the city.
