COMBATTING LITTERING - FINE DOUBLED TO £150

The Conservative government has just increased the fine for littering to £150 and given local councils new powers of enforcement.

A start could be made on the A34, either side of the Sutton Scotney Services, and followed up in and around our villages.

AVERTING TRAFFIC CHAOS

"If elected, I will work closely with our two other Conservative Councillors in the ward, so that there would be a unified and focussed approach on improving the quality of life in our villages. I will be pressing the Council to use the 20% central government increase in Planning Fees on improving the service – especially enforcement resources. A revised local plan will also put more pressure on resources. Whilst the affordable housing requirement of the local plan will help our children onto the housing ladder, it must go hand-in-hand with opposing inappropriate developments and protection of the local character of our villages and conservation areas. All housing development must be in the right place, avoiding housing 'spread' into sensitive settlements."
