2010 – After a long campaign, I was elected for the first time as part of the first coalition Government since the war. Conservatives and Liberal Democrats worked together in the national interest and my son, William, was born that November.

2011 – Backed the successful campaign to keep children's heart surgery in Southampton, held my first 'Summer Tour', brought the Health Secretary to our hospital and Schools Minister to our university.

2012 – Fought power companies to secure a reliable electricity supply in Kings Worthy, welcomed the Olympic Torch to Winchester and received a 'Fit for the Future' petition (relay style) for a new leisure centre in the city.

2013 – Opened the new scanner unit at RHCH plus Rotherley Nursery in Fulflood with Peppa Pig, met CALA Homes to discuss the 'Barton Farm' development and welcomed a royal visitor to Naomi House.

2014 – Flooding dominated as I mucked in making daily visits to Hursley, Sutton Scotney, Littleton, Twyford and the Worthies. Helped 'Save the Rec' at River Park and (quietly) turned 40.

2015 – Cut the ribbon at new Warren Hall in Micheldever, met Syrian families arriving in Winchester to flee the war and laid my wreath at the Cathedral for Remembrance Sunday. The General Election in May saw me returned with a 17,000 majority.

2016 – Spoke at the Chamber Business Breakfast, opened Happy Hounds doggy day-care in Chilcomb and chaired EU referendum debate at the Theatre Royal. Supported Theresa May as PM and became a Government Whip. **2017** – Shared Brenda from Bristol's view on "another" General Election but stood and won, again securing over 50% of the vote. Appointed Public Health Minister and opened new Dovetail Café in Chandler's Ford.

2018 – Held a rail summit as SWR began local franchise, welcomed new plans for Junction 9, spoke out over Eastleigh Council's lack of a Local Plan and brought residents together to fight latest plans for Micheldever 'new town'.

2019 – Opened new council houses in Stanmore and supported Alresford businesses concerned by business rate hikes. Opened the new A&E at Winchester Hospital and was re-elected for the fourth time.

2020 – Covid hit and the world ground to a halt but I attended Parliament every day and spoke extensively on lockdown measures and support for constituents. Took the Lord Chancellor to visit Winchester Prison.

2021 – Put in many shifts at local Covid vaccination centres, celebrated the return of cancer services to RHCH and attended the COP26 climate meeting in Glasgow.

2022 – Welcomed the end of 'smart' motorways, opened a new rehab facility at Trinity, backed Rishi Sunak for my party's leadership and delivered a tribute to the late Queen in Parliament. Elected to chair Health Select Committee.

2023 – Held urgent meetings with Southern Water over supply issues, held 'ASKtheAIRPORT' meeting in Colden Common and met Ukrainians living safely in Hiltingbury. Met King Charles III.

2024 – Spoke in favour of retaining ATR Winchester as an MoD site, brought our PM to Winchester, launched campaign to improve Winchester Station, met Southern Water (again) and visited the rebuilt Fryern School in Chandler's Ford. And (very) quietly turned 50.

Part One – Coalition May 2010 - May 2015

So much has been said about the Conservative/Liberal coalition but I think we did the right thing in the aftermath of the financial crisis while reforming education, health and welfare.



Part Three – The Brexit years June 2017 – December 2019

The House of Commons doesn't work well in a hung Parliament, and we proved that during these two years. The response from

Winchester to Brexit was huge - on both sides - and I focused on respecting the outcome of a national referendum while arguing for a safe deal that recognised the closeness of the result. That led me into conflict with (new PM) Boris Johnson who subsequently withdrew the Conservative Party whip meaning I was, for a time, an independent MP.



I sometimes represent the UK as part of the Commonw Parliamentary Association (pictured in Ghana) and regularly appear on the media; here on ITV's Peston. My wife Susie and I said we would do twenty years or four General Elections – whichever came first. I will leave the House of Commons shortly (and people will have different views of the last four Parliaments in which I've served) but one thing on which we can all agree, it's been an interesting time ...

> Part Two – Small majority **Conservative Government** May 2015 - June 2017



The Cameron Government was re-elected with its own mandate in 2015 and I continued as a strong and now experienced MP. I joined the junior ranks of Government as PPS to the Health Secretary and, while I supported giving people a say on EU membership, campaigned hard for Britain to Remain. When Theresa May became Prime Minister, I joined the Government Whips Office until she (unwisely) called that fateful early General Election.



Part Four -**Big majority** Conservative Government December 2019 late 2024

Back in the fold (with. perhaps, my integrity intact) I was returned to Westminster for my final Parliament and my experience as Health Minister helped me hold Government to account as Covid hit. We have never had so much casework as we supported constituents. Backed Rishi Sunak for PM and (eventually) that happened. Chairing the high-profile Health Select Committee is the perfect way for me to conclude my career in the Commons.

FIRST AND FOREMOST A CONSTITUENCY MP



When I ran for Parliament, I said my priority was the local NHS and I would, above all else, strive to be a good constituency MP. Others can judge whether I have done that, but I hope some memorable campaigns – with maybe a few wins along the way – leave this area better than I found it.





Whether it be my popular **ASKseries of public meetings** we've held FOUR on local hospital services) or annual 'Summer Tour', I have tried to be open and accessible to all constituents despite a much changed environment for MPs.



This is unfinished business for me but we're now in the final stages - and work will soon begin - on a package worth at least £200m to completely re-design the Winnall junction of the M3.

Back in 2010 we had a major shortage of school places. One of my first campaigns led Hampshire County Council to a £10m plan for our constituency that created some 420 new primary places. That included the new all-through school at Westgate as well as investment at Winnall. St Peter's, All Saints, Harestock and Western.

We've successfully brought millions of pounds worth of nvestment to our hospital including transformed maternity suites, a refurbished A&E, the day treatment centre and a brand new outpatients department. The new 'elective hub' is next. For 17+ years, I've said I want us to retain a District General Hospital in Winchester with full-service A&E and consultant-led maternity services. I think that's clear!



We need new affordable homes and I've always worked cross-party to support the 'New Homes Programme' which has delivered for locations including Baron Close in Micheldever.



A long campaign bore fruit in 2015 as we finally got a quieter surface for junctions 9-14 of the M3. The work was brought forward to help us get a good night's sleep and I spent a very noisy night out on the road watching how they do it.
